FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 1058 - HB 1330

April 22, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Deletes an obsolete section of code, Tenn. Code. Ann. § 49-6-2406, requiring the Office of Research and Educational Accountability (OREA) in the Office of the Comptroller of the Treasury to study and report on the formation and operation of community schools to the Education Committee of the Senate and the Education Administration and Planning Committee of the House of Representatives by November 1, 2018.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (008538): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Requires a community school to designate an individual to lead and coordinate the planning and implementation of programming for the school. Adds criteria for community school grant eligibility for community schools. Removes the Department of Education's (DOE) responsibility to assist LEAs and schools with writing grants for funding community schools and requires DOE to encourage LEAs and schools to combine multiple funding sources for community schools. Encourages DOE to provide technical assistance to LEAs and schools to identify and secure funding for community schools. Authorizes LEAs and schools to use federal funds for funding community schools. Requires DOE to work with at least one statewide coalition composed of practitioners, administrators, advocates, and other stakeholders to identify opportunities for the Department to support the formation and administration of community schools.

Requires a community school to conduct a baseline analysis of the school and requires that the data collected from the analysis be transmitted to DOE in order to measure the effectiveness of the community school programming implemented at the school.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

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Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Community Schools and DOE will be able to comply with the proposed legislation using existing resources without a significant impact to expenditures.
- There is currently no funding available for community school grants.
- No change to Basic Education Program funding.
