SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Renames the Tennessee State Museum the William E. Haslam Center and requires the State Museum to fund all costs related to the signage.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

Increase State Expenditures - \$30,000/FY20-21/State Museum

Other Fiscal Impact – The cost to purchase and install signage will be covered by private funds of over \$40,000,000 received for the new home of the State Museum.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (015252): Deletes and rewrites all language after the enacting clause such that the only substantive change renames the Tennessee State Museum the “Bill Haslam Center” rather than the “William E. Haslam Center.”

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Based on information provided by the State Museum, signage will be purchased and erected on the balcony face in the grand hall.
- Based on information provided by the State Museum, it will cost approximately \$30,000 to purchase and install such signage.
- A one-time increase in state expenditures of \$30,000.
- Based on further information provided by the State Museum, such costs will be covered by part of the \$40,000,000 in private donations received by the State Museum and dedicated to the new home of the State Museum located at 1000 Rosa Parks Boulevard.
