FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 2266 - SB 2199

February 28, 2020

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Removes Nathan Bedford Forrest Day as a day of special observance.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (015180): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Removes the requirement that the Governor proclaim official days of special observance. Directs the Tennessee Code Commission to remove the language “to be proclaimed by the Governor” when it appears in an act proclaiming a special day, week, or month as a special time period of observance that was enacted by the 111th General Assembly.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Removing such requirement will have no significant fiscal impact on state government.
- The Code Commission can complete the urged action utilizing existing resources.
