FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 2332 - HB 2770

May 28, 2020

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Excludes the offense of continuous sexual abuse of a child from consideration for judicial diversion.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (017790): Changes the effective date from July 1, 2020 to upon becoming law. Removes the provision specifying that the exclusion applies to offenses committed on or after the effective date.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Based on information provided by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC), there have been zero pre-trial or judicial diversions for the offense of continuous sexual abuse of a child over the last five years.
- Any impact to state incarceration, the court system, supervisory programs overseeing probation, or fee revenue paid to a clerk of the court to process an expunction after the completion of a judicial diversion program resulting from the proposed legislation is estimated to be not significant.
