SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Changes, from 14 to 21, the number of calendar days in which a hearing requested by a police officer who has been dismissed, demoted, suspended, or transferred for punitive reasons must be set following the request.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (018026): Deletes all language after the enacting clause. Prohibits the Governor or the chief executive officer of a local government from requiring a law enforcement agency or officer to enforce a provision of an executive order that requires a private business to close or restricts the freedom to peacefully assemble or travel. Exempts the governor's use of a curfew implemented by executive order and appropriate agencies and departments from exercising their statutory authority in preventing the spread and transmission of an epidemic disease.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Prohibiting the Governor or the chief executive officer of a local government from requiring a law enforcement agency or officer to enforce a provision of an executive order that requires a private business to close or restricts the freedom to peacefully assemble or travel will not significantly impact state or local government revenue or expenditures.
- Exempting the Governor's use of a curfew implemented by executive order and appropriate agencies and departments from exercising their statutory authority to maintain sanitation standards, conduct inspections, and perform other lawfully duties to prevent the transmission and spread of an epidemic disease will not significantly impact state or local government revenue or expenditures.
