**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 162**

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Increases, from one to two, the number of regular meetings the Board of Chiropractic Examiners must hold each year.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 63-4-104, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners is required to meet one time each year plus any additional meetings as necessary.
- The board currently meets quarterly. Increasing the number of times the board is required to meet from one to two annual meetings will not increase the number of times they meet.
- Passage of this legislation will have no impact on the policies or procedures of the Division of Health Related Boards or the Department of Health; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all health related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board of Chiropractic Examiners had an annual surplus of \$15,965 in FY16-17, an annual surplus of \$69,232 in FY17-18, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$564,528 on June 30, 2018.
