HB 189 – SB 1376

February 10, 2019

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases, from 16 to 17, the age for which a person under 18 can apply for a marriage license with parental or guardian consent.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

On February 7, 2019, a fiscal note was issued estimating a fiscal impact as follows:

Decrease State Revenue – Exceeds \$300

Decrease Local Revenue – Exceeds \$300

As a result of additional information being provided by the Department of Health, the estimated fiscal impact for this bill has been corrected as follows:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Corrected assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 36-3-106, persons who are 16 may apply for a marriage license if a parent or guardian provides their consent. The proposed language would increase this age limit to 17.
- According to the Department of Health, no marriage licenses were issued to persons 16 years of age from June 2018 to December 2018, after passage of Public Chapter 1049 of 2018.
- Any impact to state or local government revenue is estimated to be not significant.
