FISCAL NOTE

HB 202 - SB 430

February 6, 2019

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires a certificate of completion instead of an affidavit be issued to municipal utility officers upon completion of required training. Requires municipalities to maintain the certificates for a period of six years.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Current law, Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-34-115(j), requires municipal utility commissioners to participate in a minimum of 12 hours of training and continuing education. Providers of any such training are required to provide an affidavit to commissioners upon completion of the training course. The affidavit is to be forwarded to the appropriate records custodian for maintenance.
- Requiring the issuance of a certificate of completion and designating a timeframe for maintenance of the certificates by municipalities will not result in any significant fiscal impact to state or local government.
