FISCAL NOTE

HB 652 - SB 1040

February 8, 2019

SUMMARY OF BILL: Decreases, from ten to five days, the time period within which a contracting party must report to a local education agency (LEA) a change in the persons designated to check a school bus pursuant to the Tennessee Children with Disabilities Transportation Act, along with the name, address, and telephone number of the designee, if the change occurs during the interim period between August 1st and the issuance of the annual report.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Tenn. Code Ann. 49-6-2114 requires that contracting parties who transport children with disabilities, and whose bus drivers do not return to a central depot, to check all buses at the end of every run to make sure no person remains on the bus.
- LEAs will be able to amend their policies in accordance with the provisions of this legislation during the normal course of business; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- No significant impact to state or local operations.
