FISCAL NOTE

HB 838 - SB 1134

March 3, 2019

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Specifies that a new conviction of a sexual offense, violent sexual offense, or violent juvenile sexual offense constitutes a violation of the Tennessee Sexual Offender and Violent Offender Registration, Verification, and Tracking Act of 2004.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-39-208, violations of Tennessee Sexual Offender and Violent Offender Registration, Verification, and Tracking Act of 2004 are a Class E felony and a violation eliminates an offender from eligibility for suspension of a sentence, diversion or probation until the minimum sentence is served in its entirety.
- Based on information provided by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, any impact to the Bureau resulting from the proposed legislation is estimated to be not significant.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Correction, a conviction resulting from the proposed legislation will be coupled with a conviction of a new criminal offense; therefore, any increase to state incarceration expenditures is estimated to be not significant.
