**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 1176 - SB 1301**

March 13, 2019

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Removes the requirement that an off-duty law enforcement officer, who is not engaged in the actual discharge of official duties and carries a firearm onto school grounds or inside a school building during regular school hours, must immediately inform the principal or administrative staff person in the principal's office.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-17-1350(c), any law enforcement officer may carry firearms at all times and in all places within Tennessee, on-duty or off-duty, regardless of the officer's regular duty hours or assignments, except one who is not engaged in the actual discharge of official duties as a law enforcement officer and carries a firearm onto school grounds or inside a school building during regular school hours unless the officer immediately informs the principal that the officer will be present on school grounds or inside the school building and in possession of a firearm. If the principal is unavailable, the notice may be given to an appropriate administrative staff person in the principal's office.
- Removing the notification requirement is not estimated to result in a significant fiscal impact to state or local government.
