FISCAL NOTE

HB 1234 - SB 1232

March 20, 2019

SUMMARY OF BILL: Modifies the appointing authority of the Governor by requiring the employee representative appointed by the Governor to serve on the Advisory Council on Workers' Compensation (ACWC) to be from organized labor.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. 50-6-121 (a)(1)(c) currently the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Speaker of the Senate, and the Governor are required to each appoint one employer and one employee representative to the ACWC, who shall be voting members.
- The proposed legislation requires only the Governor's employee appointment to be from organized labor. Any impact resulting from this legislation is estimated to be not significant.

IMPACT TO COMMERCE:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

- Requiring the Governor's appointment to the ACWC be from organized labor will have no significant impact on commerce or jobs in Tennessee.
