SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires a magistrate imposing global positioning monitoring on a defendant as a condition for bail for an offense involving domestic violence to inform the victim of how to obtain a copy of the defendant's conditions of bail, including geographic restrictions.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-11-152(d), a magistrate who has imposed global positioning monitoring on a defendant as a condition for bail for an offense involving domestic violence must provide to an alleged victim specific information including any locations that the defendant is ordered to refrain from going to or near and the minimum distances, if any, that the defendant must maintain from those locations and the fact that the victim's communications with the magistrate concerning the global positioning monitoring system and any restrictions to be imposed on the defendant's movements are not confidential.
- Including the information on how to obtain a copy of the defendant's condition of bail, including any geographic restrictions, will not result in an increase in state or local expenditures.
