FISCAL NOTE

HB 1926 – SB 2504

February 5, 2020

SUMMARY OF BILL: Decreases, from a Class B to a Class C misdemeanor, the penalty for the unlawful practice of medicine or surgery.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation will not have a significant impact on the Board of Medical Examiners; therefore any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all health related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board of Medical Examiners had an annual deficit of \$231,445 in FY17-18, an annual deficit of \$346,206 in FY18-19, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$1,962,320 on June 30, 2019.
- There will not be a sufficient number of Class C misdemeanor prosecutions for state or local government to experience any significant decrease in revenue or expenditures.
