FISCAL NOTE

HB 2263 - SB 2196

February 9, 2020

SUMMARY OF BILL: Extends, from 30 days to 60 days, the period of time in which a physician accused of performing a partial birth abortion can delay the beginning of the trial in order to allow the state medical board to determine whether the physician's conduct was necessary to save the life of the mother whose life was endangered by a physical disorder, illness or injury.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation will not significantly impact the court system or policies of the Board of Medical Examiners; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all health related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board of Medical Examiners had an annual deficit of \$231,445 in FY17-18, an annual deficit of \$346,206 in FY18-19, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$1,962,320 on June 30, 2019.
