SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases, from five years to six years, the time in which a person must have been a pharmacist under the law of this state in order to qualify for appointment to the Board of Pharmacy (BOP).

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation will not have a significant impact on the operations of the BOP; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all health related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board of Pharmacy had an annual surplus of \$811,793 in FY17-18, an annual surplus of \$484,999 in FY18-19, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$3,539,045 on June 30, 2019.
