HB 2447 – SB 2867

February 11, 2020

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases, from 10 to 20 working days, the time period after receiving a written appeal, that the state fire marshal must issue a decisive ruling over a conflict between a county and a city regarding a building or fire code issue that involves a county building located within a city.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption:

- Extending the time period in which the state fire marshal must issue a ruling in a conflict between a county and a city will have no significant impact on the Division of Fire Prevention of the Department of Commerce and Insurance or the local government.

- Extending the time period in which the state fire marshal must issue a ruling in a conflict between a county and a city will have no significant impact to jobs or commerce in Tennessee.
