FISCAL NOTE

HB 2537 - SB 2766

February 15, 2020

SUMMARY OF BILL: Expands the definition of “emergency services squad” to effectively allow additional emergency service personnel to be issued emergency license plates. Requires any such professionals to present proof prior to issuance of such plates.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- According to the Department of Revenue (DOR), as of January 2020, there were 20,075 registrations with an emergency plate.
- This legislation is estimated to result in a 10 percent increase in such registrations, or approximately 2,008 additional registrations (20,075 x 10%).
- No initial issuance requirement applies as this plate is already in use.
- The annual fee for a special license plate is \$26.50.
- This is the normal registration fee for passenger vehicles; therefore, there will be no significant increase or decrease in state revenue from issuance of these additional emergency plates.
- Any increase in costs to manufacture emergency plates over standard registration plates is assumed to be not significant.
