HB 2704 - SB 2592

SUMMARY OF BILL: Deletes an obsolete requirement for the Department of Human Services (DHS) to submit quarterly reports to the General Assembly on the implementation of a suspicion-based drug testing program for applicants for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 71-3-1202(c), DHS is required to submit quarterly reports to the General Assembly on the two-year implementation of a drug testing program for applicants for TANF benefits. The implementation period has expired; therefore, the requirement is obsolete.
- Deleting the obsolete requirement will not result in any significant fiscal impact to state or local government.
