FISCAL NOTE

HB 2812 - SB 2587

February 25, 2020

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes the state registrar to use his/her discretion to issue a delayed birth certificate based upon finding that a preponderance of the evidence weighs in favor of an applicant. Allows consideration of obituaries and birth and death certificates of parents or siblings, property tax records, sworn affidavits from two or more county officials, and other alternative documentary evidence to support the applicant's claimed place of birth.
