SB 75 - HB 129

February 26, 2019

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires custodians to make appropriate quantities of healthcare products available in housing units and medical areas to all incarcerated women in a correctional facility at no cost to inmates.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation defines a custodian as a warden, sheriff, deputy sheriff, or law enforcement officer.
- The proposed legislation defines healthcare products as feminine hygiene products, non-lye base moisturizing soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and any other healthcare product a custodian deems appropriate.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Correction and Tennessee Sheriffs Association, any impact resulting from the proposed legislation is estimated to be not significant.
