**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 901**

February 27, 2019

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Authorizes barber shops to permit dogs in the shop. Requires inspections of barber shops and barber schools to include inspection of the sterilization of clippers and other equipment used on customers.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Any additional rulemaking or training for inspectors can be accomplished by the Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners (BCBE) within existing resources.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all regulatory boards are required to be self-sufficient over any two-year period. The BCBE experienced a surplus of \$50,787 in FY16-17, a surplus of \$333,255 in FY17-18, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$614,875 on June 30, 2018.

**IMPACT TO COMMERCE:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation authorizes barber shops to permit dogs in the shop, if they so choose. Any increase in the time required for inspections is estimated to be minimal.
- Any impact to commerce or jobs in Tennessee is estimated to be not significant.
