FISCAL NOTE

SB 1121 – HB 1341

February 8, 2019

SUMMARY OF BILL: Deletes obsolete section of statute, Tenn. Code Ann. § 63-31-114, that required the Polysomnographic Professional Standards Committee to conduct a meeting in each of the years 2007-2010 to allow public discussion of new developments in the practice of polysomnography.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The deletion of the obsolete language from Tennessee Code Annotated will not have a significant impact on the procedures or processes of the health related boards, or the Department of Health; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-29-121, all health related boards are required to be self-supporting over a two-year period. The Board of Medical Examiners had an annual deficit of \$4,714 in FY16-17, an annual deficit of \$231,445 in FY17-18, and a cumulative reserve balance of \$2,467,326 on June 30, 2018.
