SB 1903 - HB 2037

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes the restoration of voting rights for a person current on installment payments of restitution costs to the victim or victims of an offense.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-29-202(b), a person is not eligible to have voting rights restored unless the person has paid all restitution to the victim, has paid all court costs due at the conclusion of the person's trial, and is current on all child support obligations.
- The proposed legislation would authorize such right to be restored if the person is current on installment payments of restitution costs, and has paid all court costs and child support obligations.
- Restoration of voting rights for such persons will not result in a significant fiscal impact to state or local government.
