FISCAL NOTE**

SB 2222 - HB 2507

February 27, 2020

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires, upon approval of the design and completion of the monument or statue honoring David Crockett by the State Capitol Commission (SCC), that such monument or statue be placed upon the pedestal above the entrance to the Motlow Tunnel on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. Requires that the statue of Edward Carmack be relocated to an appropriate location on capitol grounds, as determined by the SCC.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

On February 14th, a fiscal note was issued estimating the following impact:

Increase State Expenditures – Exceeds \$152,200/FY20-21/State Capitol Commission

After further consideration, it was determined the fiscal impact was in error. As a result, the estimated fiscal impact has been corrected as follows:

Increase State Expenditures – Exceeds \$41,200/FY20-21/State Capitol Commission

Corrected Assumptions:

- Tennessee Code Annotated § 4-1-401 created the David Crockett Commission to erect a monument or statue honoring David Crockett on the grounds of the state capitol.
- It is assumed that a statue of David Crockett will be commissioned, developed, and constructed under current law in the absence of this legislation.
- The proposed legislation will require such statue to be placed on the pedestal above the entrance to the Motlow Tunnel, at the current location of the Edward Carmack's statue.
- Tennessee Code Annotated § 4-1-412(b) prohibits any memorial regarding a historic conflict, historic entity, historic event, historic figure, or historic organization that is, or is located on, public property, from being removed, renamed, relocated, altered, rededicated, or otherwise disturbed or altered, unless a public entity exercising control of the memorial petitions the Tennessee Historical Commission (THC) for a waiver of such prohibition.
- A notice of the petition is required to be published on the website of the public entity and in at least two newspapers. The THC is required to conduct initial and final hearings on the petition during regularly-scheduled THC meetings. Any petition that fails to receive a two-thirds vote shall be denied.

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-8-302, the State Capitol Commission (SCC) has the power and duty to, among other things, establish policy governing maintenance of the state capitol.
- Based on responses to the 2017 Local Government Survey conducted by the Fiscal Review Committee staff, participating local government officials reported the average cost for a newspaper notification is \$114. The total one-time cost of publishing a notice of the petition in two newspapers is estimated to be \$228 (\$114 x 2).
- According to the Department of General Services (DGS), the estimated cost to move the Edward Carmack statue to what is a currently unknown location would be approximately \$11,000.
- Assuming that the new site for the Edward Carmack statue requires granite slab, the DGS estimates that such site preparation will cost approximately \$30,000.
- The pedestal currently on such site has the name of Edward Carmack engraved upon it on a stone plaque; thus a new stone plaque would need to be purchased.
- A quote attained by the DGS estimates the cost of a new pedestal at approximately \$10,000. However, it is assumed that similar pedestal would be required under current law, regardless of where the David Crockett statue is placed.
- The cost to place the David Crockett statue on the new pedestal above the entrance to the Motlow Tunnel is estimated to equal that to relocate the Edward Carmack statue, or approximately \$11,000. However, it is assumed that similar cost of placing the David Crockett statue would be incurred under current law. Therefore, placing this statue in above the entrance to the Motlow Tunnel will not result in additional state expenditures.
- A one-time increase in state expenditures to the SCC in FY20-21 of \$41,228 (\$228 + \$11,000 + \$30,000).
