**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 2276 - HB 2621**

February 9, 2020

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Specifies the term "crime of violence" in regard to weapons offenses includes aggravated rape of a child, rather than especially aggravated rape of a child.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 39-17-1301, a crime of violence includes any degree of murder, voluntary manslaughter, aggravated rape, rape, rape of a child, especially aggravated rape of a child, aggravated sexual battery, especially aggravated robbery, aggravated robbery, burglary, aggravated burglary, especially aggravated burglary, aggravated assault, kidnapping, aggravated kidnapping, especially aggravated kidnapping, carjacking, trafficking for commercial sex act, especially aggravated sexual exploitation, felony child abuse, and aggravated child abuse.
- Clarifying that the term crime of violence in regard to weapons offenses includes aggravated rape of a child, rather than especially aggravated rape of a child will not significantly affect sentencing or the number of handgun carry permits; therefore, there will not be a significant fiscal impact to state or local government.
