**FISCAL NOTE**

**SB 2314 - HB 2732**

May 8, 2020

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Effective November 3, 2020, authorizes members of the General Assembly whose principal residence is 50 miles or less from the Capitol to be paid a mileage allowance for legislative meetings or functions on Fridays.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Increase State Expenditures - \$400/FY20-21  
\$600/FY21-22 and Subsequent Years**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 3-1-106(c), a member whose principal resident is 50 miles or less from the Capitol is currently paid a mileage allowance for legislative meetings or functions on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday.
- According to Legislative Administration, members whose principal residence is 50 miles or less from the Capitol made 28 trips for legislative meetings or functions on a Friday in 2019.
- The number of trips made by these members for legislative functions or meetings on Fridays is estimated to remain consistent.
- The average roundtrip mileage allowance for a member living 50 miles or less from the Capitol is \$19.95.
- An increase in state expenditures of \$559 (28 x \$19.95).
- Due to an effective date of November 3, 2020, an increase in state expenditures estimated to be \$375 (\$559 x 67.0%) in FY20-21.
- A recurring increase in state expenditures, beginning in FY21-22, of \$559.
