

AN ACT to amend Chapter 519 of the Private Acts of 1953, as amended by Chapter 259 of the Private Acts of 1965, Chapters 99, 101, 102 and 105 of the Private Acts of 1991, and all other acts amendatory thereto, relative to the board of commissioners of the City of Crossville.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 519 of the Private Acts of 1953, as amended by Chapter 259 of the Private Acts of 1965, Chapters 99, 101, 102 and 105 of the Private Acts of 1991, and all other acts amendatory thereto, is amended by deleting the last paragraph of the section designated as Section 5 by Chapter 259 of the Private Acts of 1965, and substituting instead the language:

At the first election following the adoption of this act, the terms of the two commissioners (councilmembers) receiving the highest number of votes shall be four (4) years and the terms of the remaining two commissioners (councilmembers) shall be two (2) years. Thereafter, the terms of the commissioners (councilmembers) shall be four (4) years.

SECTION 2. Chapter 519 of the Private Acts of 1953, as amended, is further amended by deleting the language "Board of Commissioners" wherever it appears, and substituting instead the language "City Council".

SECTION 3. Chapter 519 of the Private Acts of 1953, as amended, is further amended by deleting the language "Commissioners" wherever it appears, and substituting instead the language "Councilmembers".

SECTION 4. Chapter 519 of the Private Acts of 1953, as amended, is further amended by deleting the language "City Recorder" wherever it appears, and substituting instead the language "City Clerk".

SECTION 5. Chapter 519 of the Private Acts of 1953, as amended, is further amended by deleting the language "City Treasurer" wherever it appears, and substituting instead the language "Finance Director".

SECTION 6. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the governing body of the City of Crossville. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the City of Crossville and certified to the secretary of state.

SECTION 7. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 6.
