SUBJECT: **HB 314 - SB 448**

This bill, if enacted, will allow employers to require employees to make co-payments under the employer's workers' compensation policy, and allow the employer's workers' compensation insurance carrier for medical expenses to require a reasonable co-payment of the employee.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill is estimated to be a decrease in state expenditures to the Claims Award Fund; if the state elected as a self-insured employer to institute a medical co-payment; however, such decrease cannot be determined but is estimated to exceed \$100,000.

Enactment of this bill is also estimated to result in a decrease in local government expenditures; however, such decrease is estimated to be not significant.
