

## **FISCAL NOTE**

SUBJECT: **HB 603 - SB 1385**

This bill, if enacted, will specify that the appropriate court clerk or such clerk's authorized deputy will be the person responsible for preparing abstracts of convictions for traffic offenses. This bill requires that errors be corrected within 30 days, denies the return of the \$10 fee to clerks if the report is not forwarded within 30 days of the date of conviction and requires the Commissioner of Safety to devise a procedure to amend, correct or modify any abstract for the sake of accuracy.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill is estimated to be a reduction in local government revenues as a result of the loss of the \$10 fee when localities fail to meet time limits specified in this bill. The amount of decrease would depend upon the number of occurrences but is estimated not to exceed \$100,000. To the extent that localities do not receive the \$10 fee, state revenue loss would be avoided by a corresponding amount, since the state would retain such revenue.

Enactment of this bill is also estimated to result in an increase in state expenditures to administer provisions of this act, but such increase is estimated not to be significant.
