SUBJECT: **HB 2796 - SB 3018**

This bill, if enacted, will allow the arrest, without a warrant, of an individual that a police officer has reasonable cause to believe has committed the offense of prostitution.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill is estimated to be a decrease in local government expenditures to the extent that fewer warrants will have to be issued for such arrests to take place. Such decrease cannot be determined but is estimated to be not significant.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill will depend upon the additional number of persons convicted of this offense who may otherwise not have been arrested and the resultant increased cost to local governments to confine such persons versus the increased revenues to local governments from fines levied and collected under the provisions of this bill. Therefore, the fiscal impact cannot be readily determined, but is estimated to be not significant.
