SUBJECT: **HJR 474**

This resolution, if adopted, will continue the special joint committee to study the drainage of streams and rivers and the restoration of wetlands in West Tennessee for one (1) year.

The special joint committee is composed of three (3) Senators and three (3) Representatives. The six (6) member committee shall report its final findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the One Hundredth General Assembly no later than February 1, 1997, at which time the committee shall cease to exist.

The fiscal impact from adoption of this resolution is estimated to be an increase in state expenditures of \$952 for each one day meeting of the committee.
