SUBJECT: **SENATE BILL 4**

This bill, if enacted, will require seizure and impoundment of vehicles used while driving under the influence of intoxicants. The bill requires impoundment for 28 days on the second conviction. Any seized vehicle shall be impounded by the police or sheriff's departments and costs associated with the impoundment shall be paid by the person claiming the vehicle. The bill provides that impounded vehicles not claimed within 30 days will be subject to disposal as an abandoned motor vehicle.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill is estimated to result in an increase in first year state and local government expenditures from seizure and impoundment of vehicles and an increase in first year state and local government revenues from reimbursement by persons claiming vehicles and from sales of vehicles seized and not returned; however, a reasonable estimate of the impact on state and local governments cannot be determined but the net impact is estimated not to be significant.
