SUBJECT: **SB 2510 - HB 2845**

This bill, if enacted, will amend the Osteopathic Physicians Practice Act to require interns, residents and clinical fellows in an osteopathic training program to apply to the Board of Osteopathic Examiners for a license exemption. The board may deny, suspend, revoke or issue restricted training licenses. The board is authorized to impose a fee for the application and the interns are exempted from the \$200 professional tax.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill is estimated to increase state expenditures. The amount of such expenditures cannot be determined but is estimated to be not significant because few such interns are enrolled each year.

The fiscal impact is also estimated to increase state revenues from any possible fee imposed by the board. However, the amount of such revenues cannot be determined but is estimated to be not significant.
