SUBJECT: **SB 2842 - HB 2600**

This bill, if enacted, will provide that: 1) no LEA shall submit a budget to the local legislative body that would result in reduced local spending on a per pupil basis than the previous year; and 2) no local legislative body shall adopt a budget that results in less local spending on a per pupil basis than was appropriated in the previous fiscal year.

The fiscal impact from enactment of this bill is estimated to be an increase in local government expenditures* of approximately \$1,300,000. This estimate is based on an analysis of LEA local revenues and average daily memberships for FY 1993-94 and FY 1994-95 which indicates that had this bill been in effect at that time, 47 LEAs would have had to raise local spending by a total of \$1,317,159 in order to be in compliance with the provisions of the bill.
