SUBJECT: **SB 2977 - HB 2819**

This bill, if enacted, will require state agencies receiving block grants to insure the greatest possible formal and informal input from citizens, non-profit agencies, service providers and citizens on the planning and policy decisions about block grants. The departments are to provide these groups with prompt access to information and new policies about block grants and to report to specified committees of the legislature each year about agency decisions regarding block grant programs.

The fiscal impact of this bill is estimated to be an increase in state expenditures but the increase is estimated to be not significant. The bill requires that the cost of compliance is to be assumed by each agency.
